'LOOK, THERE IS THE LAMB OF GOD'.




At the heart of the vision at Knock Shrine is the **Lamb of God** standing on an altar with the cross above the altar.

Today John the Baptist is pointing out Jesus to the disciples and told them that Jesus is the '**Lamb of God**'. The disciples went on and told others that they had found the Messiah.

During the Passover the Israelites sacrificed a lamb and marked their doorposts with its blood. In the New Covenant the death of Jesus coincided with the Passover marking a new covenant between God and the people. The blood of the lamb gave protection to the people while the blood of Jesus offers spiritual protection and freedom from bondage. Jesus the Lamb frees us from the bondage of sin.

The Holy Year of Hope finishes on January 6th



Pope Leo XIV will conclude Jubilee year by closing the **Holy Door** in **St. Peter's Basilica** in the Vatican on 6th January – the Solemnity of the **Epiphany**.

Earlier in the year before Pope Francis passed away, he announced the closing of the Holy Door and expressed his hope: *"That the light of Christian Hope may illumine every man and woman as a message of God's love addressed to all! and 'may the Church bear faithful witness to this message in every part of the world!"*

Where Pope Leo might visit in 2026

On his way back from Turkey Pope Leo was asked by journalists on the flight where he might visit in 2026?

"As for trips, nothing is certain yet. I hope to make a trip to Africa. That would possibly be the next trip," he said. "Personally, I hope to go to Algeria to visit the places from the life of St. Augustine, but also to continue the dialogue, building bridges between the Christian world and the Muslim world."

He also said that he was *"working on some other countries,"* including several in Latin America.

"Obviously, I would love to visit Latin America; Argentina, and Uruguay are waiting for the pope's visit. Peru, I think they will receive me, too! And then, if I go to Peru, (I could visit) many neighboring countries as well. But the plan is not yet defined," he said.
